Discussions, decisions & directions

The weeks between Thanksgiving and the New Year -- traditionally busy and eventful -- have been particularly notable for the GLC. Due to the holidays and transitions of the organization, the December 1994 and January 1995 issues of the GLC newsletter were not produced during this unsettled period. This issue will review the events of the last two months.

December 1 membership meeting

December began with a special meeting of the GLC membership. During the meeting, the 30 people in attendance briefly stated their appreciation for the GLC and its mission and expressed hope that the organization would continue. Members stressed the relevance of the GLC as:

"... to push forward the frontiers of learning."

"An intellectual forum [for] peace and understanding...."

"Providing understanding of social issues in the rest of the world."

"... learning about others through programs and ethnic dinners."

"An open forum for controversial issues and getting both sides."

"... helping others to become aware of the world."

"... bringing a piece of the world to Wichita."

"... diverse and open-minded ... please don't close, I just found you!"

However, despite its noble mission, others acknowledged the GLC has struggled with understaffed committees and functions and insufficient finances.

Howard and Jeanne Johnston presented an annual report to conclude the meeting.

December board meetings

A board meeting on December 1 reviewed members' comments and

discussed if and how the GLC should continue.

There were varied ideas for resolving the imbalance of expenses against income, and personnel versus work to be done; the majority spoke for continuing in a diminished capacity and overhead. Possibilities mentioned were:

- Vacate the Broadway office.
- Preserve the country and global issues files in the Peace & War/Global Issues (PW/GI) room on the WSU campus. Develop a supportive relationship with the neighboring office of the Multi-Cultural Resource Center (MCRC).
- Move the administrative functions of the GLC (phone, mailing address, business and membership files, etc.) to Inter-Faith Ministries (IFM).

After discussions, a motion was approved to maintain the GLC as a legal entity; a reevaluation of goals and a mission would begin after the holidays. It was decided to reduce overhead by shifting the office into a storage. A team of volunteers and board members boxed and packaged office supplies on December 3.

During a board meeting on December 13, it was decided to accept two generous offers of donated office space from IFM headquarters and the PW/GI group. An arrangement with the IFM receptionist to handle GLC phone calls and receive walk-in visitors was suggested. Also, it was proposed that Signe Knee, MCRC director, be appointed to the GLC board to provide limited representation at the site.

January 10 board meeting

Additional plans to vacate the Broadway office and move to new locations were discussed during a January board meeting. Concerns The GLC has vacated its south Broadway office. We apologize for any inconvenience this move may have caused. Please make note of our two new locations now open.

For 50 years the United Nations has been a world assembly with ambitious goals which include:

- resolving conflict/waging peace
- · advancing human rights
- promoting understanding between nations/ethnic groups

The United Nations was founded, in part, because charter members realized that no nation, no matter how rich or powerful, could solve global problems unilaterally. Global problems require solutions from a diverse community of problem-solvers.

The Global Learning Center shares many U.N. goals and, in recognition of our common mission, will commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the United Nations with special events during

the month of October. A commemorative banquet and program will be presented on October 22 at 6 p.m.. The GLC has also made a formal request to the mayor and county commissioners to have October 24 proclaimed as United Nations Day in Wichita and Sedgwick County.

Despite the U.N.s accomplishments, the GLC encourages everyone to critically consider the U.N.'s policies and achievements. How effective has it been in solving world problems? What hopes are there for the next 50 years? The United Nations is worthy of both commemoration and evaluation during this month and for the rest of this special anniversary year.
